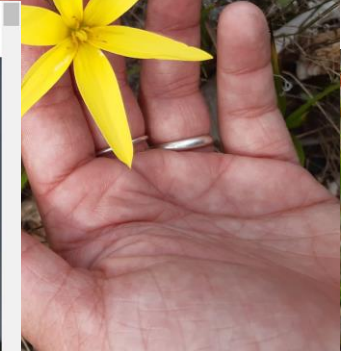

FoTP hosted 2 guided night walks through Lower Tokai Park: one on **Tuesday 5 November 2019**, and one on **Thursday 27 February 2020**, starting at sunset each time. Each evening hosted between **20 and 30 people**.

Some of the fauna that were seen included Pygmy Mice, Chameleons, scorpions (*Parabuthus capensis*, *Uroplectes lineatus* and *Opisthophthalmus capensis*), snakes (Mole Snakes and Slug Eaters), frogs and toads, spiders and insects galore, and the occasional bat.

REGIONAL AWARD - Tony Rebelo

Dr. Tony Rebelo of the South African National Biodiversity Institute has worked successfully towards the restoration of the unique Cape Flats Sand Fynbos habitat and its critically endangered plant species at Tokai Park. His program uses a noteworthy application of holistic and structured restoration methods including the baseline assessment of seed banks and species' gaps, benchmarking with reference data, management of invasive species, re-introduction of missing species, and ongoing monitoring. 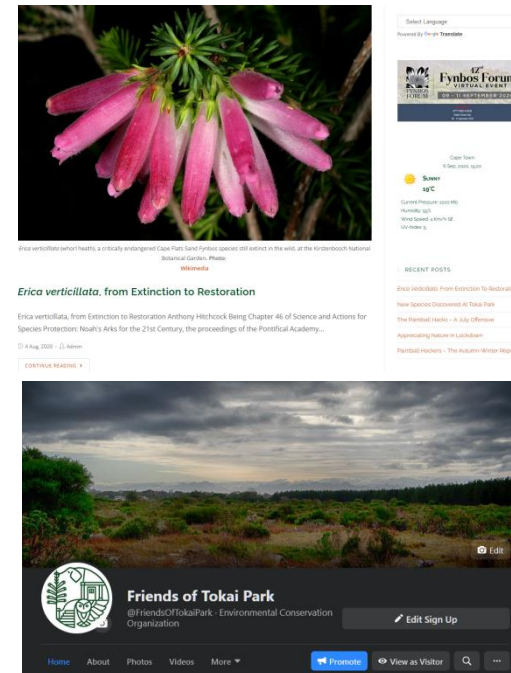


Attaining balance on social media and our website
